Alison Salloum, PhD, LCSW is a Professor at the University of South Florida, School of Social Work. She received her MSW and PhD from Tulane University School of Social Work. Dr. Salloum has extensive clinical experience providing treatment for children and families who have experienced traumatic events. Dr. Salloum's research focuses on implementation of trauma-related evidence-based treatments; service delivery methods to address treatment barriers for children and their families; childhood trauma, loss, and anxiety; and ways to support helping professionals so that they may serve others effectively.

She is the author of *Grief and Trauma in Children: A Evidence-Based Treatment Manual* (Routledge, 2015), *Group Work with Adolescents after Violent Death: A Manual for Practitioners* (Brunner-Routledge, 2004) and *Reactions: A Workbook for Children Experiencing Grief and Trauma* (Centering Corporation, 1998). Dr. Salloum has presented workshops nationally and internationally to help clinicians working with children who suffer from grief and trauma, and is the author of numerous publications regarding trauma-informed care and childhood trauma.
